REPORT FROM DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Welcome to Week 3, Term, 2018. The year has started very well and students have settled quickly into their school routines.

On Friday 9 February, over 700 Chrome Books were distributed to students in Years 7-10.

To receive a Chrome book, students in Years 7-10 need to return the Chrome book form, signed by the parent/carer and the student. Please contact the Front Office on 614 23388 if you require a chrome book form.

Parents/carers are asked to check their emails and the school website on a regular basis to keep up-to-date with activities across the school.

All parents/carers are reminded that secondary students should not be at school before 8.15am, when a teacher is on duty.

Primary students should not be at school before 8.30am, when primary teachers are on duty, unless students (K-6) have been enrolled in the primary 'Before school program'. All students should be picked up by 3.40pm, unless students (K-6) are enrolled in the primary 'After school program'.

All parents/carers are advised there is a catch-up photograph day, Friday 23 February for any students who were absent when the photographers were in the school.

Year 10 parents/carers are reminded that Year 10 students will be taking part in Personal Project Roundtables on Wednesday 28 February and Thursday 1 March. Roundtables are part of the Personal Project journey for the Middle Years Programme. Year 10 students attend school on these days only when they are presenting to the Roundtable panel. Year 10 students can spend their time undertaking Year 10 assignments when not at the panel meetings.

Parents/carers are encouraged to contact Megan Taylor (Personal Project Coordinator) if they can be a panel member on the Round tables. megan.taylor@ed.act.edu.au If you can spare one or two hours between 9.00-2.00pm please contact Megan.

No experience is necessary; all panel members will be given clear guidelines and assessment sheets to guide them through the process. The panel consists of year 10 teachers, parents/carers, community members and Year 9 students.

Bienvenue en cette troisième semaine du premier trimestre. L'année scolaire a bien commencé et nos élèves se sont rapidement installés dans leurs routines scolaires.

Students are encouraged to reflect on the impact of behaviours and take a "time-in" approach to restoring relationships. Please feel welcome to contact myself, Mrs. Kylie Louis (614 23379), Ms. Mary De Poorter (614 23393), Mr. Adam Fahey (Youth Worker 614 23358), or the appropriate Year Co-coordinator to discuss concerns and enable us to facilitate relevant appointments and communication on your behalf. This year we welcome Mr. Cade Williams, as Year 9 Coordinator, and Mrs. Melanie Consola, who joins our team as Year 7 Coordinator. Mr. Nick Rothwell (Year 10) and Mrs. Diana Webster (Year 8) return as Year Coordinators for their relevant cohorts. We also welcome School Psychologists Dr. Stephanie Hawke and Ms. Kimberlee McFarlane to our team.

All new students were given a "Welcome to Teloopa Park School" booklet to support their transition to our school. Students are always encouraged to visit Student Services to get a fresh piece of fruit, use the microwaves and hot water urns during recess and lunchtimes, and seek support in any way. Breakfast Club is held on Wednesday mornings from 8.15am and all students are encouraged to come and say hello!

Study organisation and routines are key components to successful students. Every student was provided with a 2018 Teloopa Park School Diary on the first day of term. Please take the time to support your student by requesting to view, and sign, semester Unit Outlines for each subject and discuss which items on the Assessment Calendar are relevant. Parents/carers are encouraged to join Managebac and access your child's assessment items, progress and resources. Our Year Coordinators are also available to assist your student in study, organisation and goal setting. A Study Group is available on Wednesday afternoons from Week 2 for assistance with homework and assignments in our flexible learning space, A1. Contact Student Services for permission notes and information on the Study Group. Mathematics support is also available in the Library on Thursday lunchtimes for all students. Details of these, and many more groups, are provided during Contact Group in the Student Daily Notices.

It is imperative that the school has up to date information with which to communicate with parents/cares. Please inform Student Services of any change in contact details, such as phone numbers and addresses, as soon as possible. Your child received a "Detailed Information Sheet" during Contact Group last week for you to review, update and return to Student Services as soon as possible. Please, also, know that Student Services has information regarding an ACT Government scheme which provides financial assistance to support low-income earning families with education expenses through the Secondary Bursary Scheme as well as MyWay Bus Concession Student Transport Program applications.

Attendance is crucial for students to achieve to their potential and maintain connectivity with the school. School hours are **8.45am – 3.15pm, Monday – Friday**. Students arriving late to school are expected to sign in at Student Services, regardless of time, with a note explaining their absence. This is a legal requirement. A parent/carer must contact the school within five days to

explain an absence from school. The most effective way of communicating with the school is via email:

student.welfare@teloopa.act.edu.au or phone: 614 23385 (with a subsequent letter or email). Parents/carers are encouraged to have signed up for SMS/emails which notify when a student is marked not in attendance at school by 10.00am each day. Please, also, note that students are not to attend school before 8.15am each day. Students requiring to leave the school for any reason during the day must provide a permission note from a parent/carer, collect a Leave Pass at Student Services and wait at the Front Office at to be collected. It would be greatly appreciated if students could gain their Leave Pass as early as possible in the day and are punctual when waiting for their parents/carers. Students are also reminded that if they become injured or unwell during the school day they need to request a note to attend First Aid, who will contact their parents/carers.

Teloopa Park School has a school uniform which should be respected by all students. Black leather shoes are an occupational health and safety requirement of many subjects and students not adhering to these regulations may be excluded from taking part in classes in Arts, Technology and Science. Please feel welcome to contact me to discuss difficulties surrounding access to uniform, as well as any other necessities for school.

Please be aware that all devices not being used for classwork must be switched off, and out of sight, whilst in the school buildings. Students are permitted to use mobile phones during recess and lunchtimes only. Please, also, be aware that security of personal items is the responsibility of students. If students need to bring valuable items to school, please secure the valuables and do not leave items in bags whilst unattended. PE provides a secure storage of items during class. Student Services can store valuables for the day when items must be brought to school. Students are strongly encouraged to keep their valuables in lockers, PE storage or on their person whilst at school. L'année scolaire 2018 est aujourd'hui bien entamée et les classes de primaire sont déjà engagées dans un grand nombre de projets (Francophonie), camps, sorties pédagogiques (Festival du Film Français, Musée National).

Cette rentrée a été l'occasion de mettre en place au primaire de nouveaux dispositifs destinés à la réussite de nos élèves et à la qualité des conditions d'apprentissage : alternance français/anglais plus régulière en Kindergarten afin que nos élèves soient exposés aux deux langues quasiment tous les jours, création d'une classe Bonus bénéficiant de l'expertise d'un enseignant spécialisé afin d'apporter un soutien aux élèves le nécessitant, création d'une classe multi-niveaux en CM1/CM2 afin de conserver des effectifs raisonnables en CM1. Nous avons également la chance d'accueillir parmi nous, cette année Anna Mc Gown qui se présente à vous ci-dessous. C'est une formidable opportunité de travailler avec une professionnelle qui a pour objectif de sensibiliser les enseignants et les élèves à un meilleur environnement scolaire, afin de former des élèves indépendants et motivés.

En ce début d'année, je me dois aussi de rappeler certaines règles qui doivent être respectées par tous afin que notre établissement fonctionne correctement et dans le respect de tous:

- Arrivée des élèves avant 8.30 : aucun enfant ne doit être présent dans les locaux avant 8.30, heure à laquelle la surveillance débute. En cas d'urgence, nous ne serions pas en mesure d'assurer la sécurité de ces enfants.
- Rencontres avec les personnels de l'école : afin de faciliter la communication entre les familles et l'école, il est préférable de prendre rendez-vous avant de venir rencontrer un professeur ou un executive teacher. Les personnels de l'école ont en effet des obligations et des réunions en dehors des heures scolaires et ne peuvent pas toujours se rendre disponibles au pied levé.
- Lors de communications par email, merci de respecter les dispositions mentionnées dans la note qui vous est parvenue cette semaine. Il est notamment essentiel de ne pas utiliser ce moyen de communication pour évoquer un problème pour la première fois. Une rencontre en personne est recommandée pour ce type de situation afin d'établir une relation de confiance.

Vie scolaire au primaire: bienvenue à Anna McGown

Je souhaite me présenter car je suis la nouvelle personne en charge des services aux élèves de primaire de Telopea Park School. Mon nom est Anna McGown, j'arrive à Telopea Park School avec 31 ans d'expérience dans l'enseignement primaire et secondaire. Mon rôle, cette année, sera axé sur le bien-être, l'engagement et le soutien des élèves. L'apprentissage émotionnel social est une partie essentielle de l'apprentissage des élèves et sera également un objectif majeur cette année. La compétence personnelle et sociale du curriculum australien sera le domaine que je conduirai et cette partie importante du programme sera liée aux valeurs fondamentales de Telopea: Coopération, Honnêteté, Équité et Respect.

Le fait de commencer l'école est une étape importante dans la vie de tout enfant, qui peut entraîner un mélange d'émotions pour les parents / tuteurs et les enfants. Travailler en partenariat est vraiment important pour moi, car cela se traduit généralement par des résultats positifs pour tous les élèves. Sur le plan éducatif, ma philosophie est basée sur le principe que tous les élèves peuvent apprendre et c'est notre travail en tant qu'éducateurs de fournir à chaque enfant les compétences nécessaires pour permettre aux enfants de devenir des apprenants tout au long de la vie. Il est également vital qu'ils s'épanouissent à chaque étape de leur développement. L'apprentissage et le bien-être des élèves sont intrinsèquement liés et le renforcement de la résilience est la clé du succès.

La résilience peut avoir un certain nombre de significations différentes, mais est généralement comprise comme «la capacité de rebondir après des événements défavorables de la vie». Cela peut être aussi simple ou complexe que d'apprendre que les règles à la maison et à l'école peuvent être différentes. Une façon de soulager l'anxiété au cours de ces premières semaines est de parler à vos enfants de ce à quoi s'attendre à l'école et que les choses peuvent être différentes pour eux cette année. Michael Grose, un éducateur des parents, a déclaré que lorsque les enfants sont encouragés à développer leurs compétences d'indépendance, sachant que leurs attentes peuvent changer par rapport à leurs enseignants et qu'ils sentent que leurs parents et leurs soignants sont positifs sur leur transition, ils développeront leur résilience.

Je me sens privilégiée de faire partie d'une communauté qui a été si accueillante. J'ai passé du temps au cours des premières semaines à apprendre à connaître certains d'entre vous et je suis impatiente de connaître tous les étudiants et les familles dans un proche avenir.

PRIMARY NEWS

The 2018 school year is now well underway and the primary classes are already engaged in a large number of projects (Francophonie), camps, educational outings (French Film Festival, National Museum).

This new school year has been the opportunity to implement plans for the success of our students and the quality of learning conditions: alternating French / English more regularly in Kindergarten so that our students are exposed to both languages almost every day, the creation of a "bonus class" benefiting from the expertise of a specialised teacher to provide support to the students who need it, and the creation of a multi-level class in Y4/Y5 in order to maintain a reasonable number of students in Year 4. We are also very fortunate to welcome Anna McGown this year, who will introduce herself below. This is a great opportunity to work with a professional who aims to train teachers and educate students to develop a better school environment, helping them to become independent and motivated students.

At the beginning of the year, I must also remind you of some rules that must be respected by all so that our establishment operates properly and with respect:

- Arrival of pupils before 8.30 am: no child must be present in the premises before 8.30 am, at which time the supervision starts. In case of emergency, we would not be able to ensure the safety of these children.
- Meetings with school staff: to facilitate communication between families and the school, it is best to make an appointment before coming to meet a teacher or an executive teacher. School staff have obligations and meetings outside school hours and cannot always be available at short notice.
- When communicating by email, thank you for respecting the provisions mentioned in the note that reached you this week. It is particularly important not to use this means of communication to raise a problem for the first time. An in-person meeting is recommended for this type of situation to establish a relationship of trust.

Student welfare in Primary: welcome to Anna McGown

I would like to introduce myself as I am the new executive teacher for Student Services Telopea Park School (Primary). My name is Anna McGown, I come to Telopea Park School with 31 years of teaching experience in both primary and secondary settings. My role, this year, will be focused on student wellbeing, engagement and support. Social Emotional Learning is a vital part of student learning and will also be a major focus while I am here this year. The Australian Curriculum's Personal and Social Capability will be the area that I will drive and this important part of the curriculum will link to Telopea's core values of, Co-operation, Honesty, Fairness and Respect.

Starting school is a significant step in any child's life which may bring with it a mix of emotions for both parents/carers and children. Working in partnership is really important to me as this usually results in positive outcomes for all students. Educationally, my philosophy is based on the premise that all students can learn and it is our job as educators to provide each child with the skills to enable children to become lifelong learners. It is also vital that they thrive at each stage of their development. Student learning and wellbeing are intrinsically linked and building resilience is a key to success.

Resilience may have a number of different meanings but is generally understood as, "the ability to bounce back from adverse life events." This may be as simple or as complex as learning that rules at home and at school may be different. One way to ease anxiety during these early weeks is to talk to your children about what to expect at school and that things may be different for them this year. Michael Grose, a parenting educator, has stated that when children are encouraged to develop their independent skills, know that expectations may change from their teachers and that they feel that their parents and carers are positive about their transition then they will develop resilience.

I feel privileged to be part of a community which has been so welcoming. I have spent some time over the first weeks getting to know some of you and am eager to get to know all students and families in the near future.

- **Lost Property Coordinator(s):** This position involves sorting the cupboards every 1/2 weeks. Items need to be separated into named and unnamed items. One person has already volunteered for the position, but the job will be easier and more enjoyable if there are two or more people.
