Raising Digital Citizens

We live in a world of hyper connectivity with unprecedented access to websites, instant messaging applications, chat rooms, social media and online forums. The following tips are offered to parents as a way to promote online safe behaviour for children.

1. Promote best use practice for using technology for education and personal interests. Be active in setting positive behaviours for using digital technology to promote learning.
2. Place computers in a prominent open area of the house. Avoid the use of computers and personal devices in the bedroom.
3. Be interested in what your child is doing online. Talk to them and familiarise yourself with their online activity. In this instance, it's okay to be hyper-alert!
4. Encourage open positive discussions about Internet use. Reassure them that you are open to discuss any topic without the threat of taking away their Internet connection.
5. Remind your child to keep personal information private. This includes their full name, contact details including their address, phone number, and passwords.
6. Avoid broadcasting personal thoughts and daily events to the world. Asked your child if they would have the same conversations with a stranger, or with their classmates face-to-face?
7. Remind them that not everything on the Internet is true. Teach them to be a critical reader and to question what they see. Be aware of Internet scams and replying to unfamiliar email addresses or URLs.
8. Set all online accounts to private.

9. Moderate online time to encourage a balanced lifestyle.
10. Establish Internet rules that are agreeable. Role model by doing the same yourself.

SECONDARY NEWS

Humanities Report

Once again students of Telopea Park School achieved excellent results in the Australian History Competition and the National Geography Competition, with most scoring distinctions or better. These tests were undertaken during Semester One and use sources of information to assess a student's skills and understanding. In the History Competition, two Year 8 students, one Year 9 student and five Year 10s received Distinctions. Emily Nguyen, in Year 9 received a High Distinction and a medallion for the highest score received by a Year 9 student in the ACT. High Distinctions were awarded to Juliette Ciacchi and Andrew Rapp of Year 10.

Similar results were also achieved in the National Geography Competition. Three students were awarded Distinctions, and High Distinctions were received by Dharan Ravichander, Selina Li, Rosa Mason and Swaathi Mouli Chandrasek. Four students achieved outstanding results ranking in the top 1% of the nation. These students were Ranusha Nanayakkara and Stephanie Carroll of Year 8 and Andrew Rapp and Zachary Needham, Year 10. Andrew and Zach each won a copy of "Reference World Atlas".

Currently, two History competitions are being advertised to Year 9 and 10 students. Both present students with the opportunity to win a study tour to France and Belgium in 2017. The first is the Australian History Teachers' Association "Simpson Prize" (details available at <http://www.simpsonprize.org>) and the second is the ACT Chief Minister's ANZAC Spirit Prize (details available at http://www.education.act.gov.au/teaching_and_learning/act-chief-ministers-anzac-spirit-prize).

In Humanities we endeavour to provide students with the opportunity to make connections with what they are learning in class to real-world examples and situations. Once again Semester One Year 9 Geography classes completed an extremely successful Anglicare Pantry Appeal as part of their unit on "Biomes and Food Security". We exceeded last year's total with just under 2000 items of non-perishable food and essential living items being donated to support people in need of emergency assistance. Thank you to all the students, parents and staff who donated goods to support our local community.

Geography students have participated in and excursions to Cotter Dam (Water and the World) to learn about Canberra's water supply and the Mugga Lane Recycling Plant (Environmental Change and Management). Four students attended a TEDx Canberra excursion with Ms Humphries and others took the opportunity to participate in the Urban Planning Competition run by the Australian Institute of Architects. In Week 10 of Term 3, Ms Aerts Line 3 History class along with Ms Averd's classes attended a presentation by Morgan Koegal the CEO of One Girl. Last year as part of Service and Action Ms Averd's Contact Group organised a fund-raising day to support "Do it in a Dress". Everyone was encouraged to wear a school dress and the money raised went towards providing education scholarships to girls in Africa. Morgan spoke about what motivates her to create change in our world, the work of One Girl and she provided numerous personal stories about the girls that the charity supports. Hopefully the students will reflect on Morgan's speech as they contemplate what Service as Action they can undertake and when studying the Civics and Citizen unit on Rights and Freedoms in Year 8.

Finally, thank you to the many parents who managed to make appointments to see their child's Humanities teacher at the recent Parent- Teacher Interviews. Times are not always convenient or well-spaced but it means a great deal to the student to know that we are working together to help them through school. We certainly appreciated the opportunity to talk to parents. A reminder that the assessment schedules will be distributed shortly. These are an excellent tool to help your child manage their time effectively as they provide an overview of when assessment tasks are due.
