REPORT FROM THE PRINCIPAL

The term has been a busy one with many activities, excursions, two swimming carnivals and camps successfully completed. I have also had the privilege of attending the International Baccalaureate World Conference in Singapore last week. I was accompanied by Michele McLoughlin, the Secondary Deputy Principal and the school's IB Coordinator. It was an excellent experience, keeping us up to date with world trends in education. There was a definite focus was on the importance of digital technologies and their place in the curriculum. We know for our students to compete in an ever-changing world they will need to be creative and innovative young people who are adaptable to change, are self-motivated and have good communication and collaboration skills.

Students have excelled in many areas of endeavour this term.

Year Group Camps and Exchanges

The Year 7 students participated in their Year Camp early this term – an excellent way for our students to get to know each other. Since then the term has progressed well for them with the support of Year 10 Peer Support Leaders, with whom they have met in Contact Groups.

Other camps this term were for Year 5 to Long Beach at the South Coast, for Year 4 students to Camp Cooba, near Cooma, and the Year 3 Camp to Birrigai, near Tidbinbilla. The teachers are to be congratulated for their commitment to their students and to the school. Camps are a huge responsibility for the teachers attending, which they do willingly.

Our secondary students involved in the French exchange this year are leaving on 3 Friday 6 April for five weeks hosted by the families at Lycée International de Grenoble. The students are accompanied by Patricia Blumstein, Executive Teacher of Languages and Baba Alhadji, secondary French teacher in the Australian Stream. The French students from Grenoble will visit Canberra and be billeted by our students in term 2.

School Board

I am pleased to announce that the Board elections have been held for one parent, one teacher and two students to sit on the School Board for the next two years. The new parent member is Ms Amali Bandara and the teacher representative is Dr Susan Blythe-Jones. We are awaiting notification of two new student Board members. I will inform the school community as soon as I know. I sincerely thank Jacinda Still who has been a Board member and the Chair of the Board for the past four years. She has demonstrated extraordinary support of the school during this time.

The principals from Narrabundah and Canberra Colleges will be attending together with representatives from ANU, Canberra University and the CIT who will be present to discuss the future pathways open for our students. All year 10 students and their parents/carers are encouraged to attend. Next term all year 10 students will be completing their Student Pathways during Enrichment. This is a requirement of the Education Directorate and these documents go with the students to college. This is part of our transition support for Year 10 into Year 11 studies.

Enrolments for 2019

The enrolments for Kindergarten, Year 7 and Year 11 for 2019 open early in term 2. Our Open Night and Expo for Year 7, 2019 students and their parents will be held at the school on Monday 7 May, starting in the school hall. Open nights for Year 11 students will be held early next term as well.

SECONDARY NEWS

Notes from the Mathematics Department

Welcome to another exciting academic year at Telopea Park School. My name is Aion Pillai and I am the SLC of Mathematics. It is my pleasure to introduce and welcome Mr Phillip Lewington to our Maths Faculty and to Telopea Park School. Mr Lewington is an experienced teacher and has a passion for embedding digital technologies in his classrooms. I am sure he will enjoy his classes and students will benefit from his tutelage and expertise.

All classes are now settled and we are in the midst of the first lot of assessments. Our main focus this year is Inquiry Learning and we are excited to be able to change the configuration of our classrooms to enable this type of learning to take place. Our new classrooms which we named Rene Descartes Centre (RDC) after a French Mathematician and Philosopher have enabled us to do this. We encourage all students to access Learning Field which is our e-book portal. In addition to this, Mathletics will continue to help students review and is a platform for students to practise the algorithmic processes of the concepts taught in class. Teachers use the results/data from here to help inform them of students' progress and competency on the various mathematical concepts taught in class.

Calculators and other equipment

Students are expected to have a scientific calculator to assist them with their work in class. They should also have an A4 exercise book. As we are using e-books it will be great if students have their devices with them during Maths lessons. Please ensure the device is charged daily to maximise its usability for class work.

Maths support

From time to time, teachers will post messages and revision notes on Managebac. I hope all students will log on to Managebac and read the information posted on upcoming events as well as curriculum information and support. Mr. Jacob Cherian offers Maths support in the Library on Thursdays at lunch and Ms Pillai offers "Maths Help" as an enrichment activity every Thursday. Most Maths teachers have set up Google Classrooms for their classes. Lessons, homework and messages will also be posted to this platform. Students should login to their Google classrooms on a regular basis. Parents can access through their children's login. Students are encouraged to seek help and support for any of their mathematical queries or concerns.

Homework

Homework may be given by teachers when there is a need to support students' learning. However, students should complete any unfinished class work and review all notes on a daily basis even if no formal homework has been set. This is an invaluable work habit to develop. As they now have access to the text books from Learning Field they can refer to the books and practise the exercises at the end of each section at home.

Competitions

Two competitions have been offered this term for students to participate.

Maths Challenge & Enrichment Program 2018

More competitions will be offered throughout the year. Traditionally Telopea students have done very well in all competitions offered. Students are encouraged to participate in these competitions to extend, enrich and develop their interest in Mathematics.

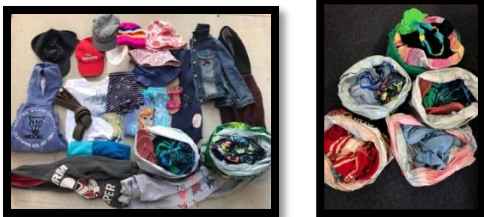



THINK BEFORE YOU PARK...AND KEEP OUR KIDS SAFE - MAKE PARKING SAFETY A PRIORITY!



Please:

- keep clear of 'no stopping' and 'no parking' zones
- don't park in bus zones on school crossings, across footpaths or driveways; and
- don't double (or triple) park.

Remember - it's okay to park a little further away from the school and walk the rest of the way!

Consider - having a pre-determined meeting spot agreed with your kids. That way if you are a little late, they know where to wait.

Think - visibility around schools and if your car may be blocking the view of crossings for other motorists. Also be mindful when entering or leaving parking spots - look twice!

Be kind - to other road users and pedestrians and also if you see any parking officers in the area - they are doing their job and working to keep our kids safe!

Note - licence Plate Recognition (or electronic chalking) vans are now actively monitoring schools. Penalties range from \$114 upwards to \$600. Details at www.act.gov.au/accessCBR
