### REPORT FROM DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Preparations are well under way for La Grande Fete. Please refer to the P & C page for ways in which you might assist in the lead up or on the day. The money raised is greatly appreciated by both staff and students, providing additional resources for the K-10 classrooms as well as upgrading the primary playground and secondary quad. The Parkour is a good example of a P & C initiative that is enjoyed by both primary and secondary students. The primary students have been rehearsing the maypole and a number of folk dances and the Year 5 and 6 Bands have also been building their repertoire of pieces. The fete is another opportunity to hear the Secondary Band who recently returned from a successful tour of England and Europe.

Our Year 4 classes should also be acknowledged for their successful entry in the ACT Science Fair. They were placed third. The integrated inquiry unit on **Clouds** was devised by Valerie Sharpe with the support of Naomi Lamb. The three classes were represented at Friday's prize giving by a small group of students who even performed a song for those in attendance. Their work will go on display in the primary library.

On Tuesday, at a special Year 3-6 assembly the students received a visit from four players from the French Rugby League team, in town for the *Rugby World Cup*. The players were accompanied by their manager and two Australian support staff. The players answered a number of student questions before being interviewed by our web radio journalists. They also signed autographs. A special thank you must go to Valerie Cretigny and Christophe NAVAUX for organising this special event.

On Thursday 26 October during lunchtime, the whole school practiced a lock down from the playground. Students and staff were advised of the procedure well in advance. Such practices are required each semester to ensure that students and staff can respond promptly and appropriately if required. Our findings from the trial will be discussed at our next Emergency Plan Committee meeting and our processes will be adjusted accordingly.

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### New Pedestrian Crossing

A new pedestrian crossing has recently been installed on Telopea Park (near New South Wales Crescent) to provide safe access for our students accessing the school. Unfortunately, the addition of the new crossing has led to a couple of incidents and number of near misses which may have put the children's safety at risk.

Under the [Australian Road Rules](#), a driver approaching a pedestrian crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary, stop safely before the crossing and must give way to any pedestrian on a pedestrian crossing.

While motorists are required to give way to students on the crossing, children need to remain vigilant and not step onto the crossing until the cars have actually stopped. Although bicycle riders are not required to get off their bike while crossing, it is advised they ride at a speed of a pedestrian.

Following the introduction of any new infrastructure, it takes time for everyone (road users and pedestrians) to be aware of the new requirements imposed on them, so it is important to take care when in the vicinity of the crossing.

Please be aware of the new crossing and drive slowly and be courteous around the school. Creating a safe environment around our school requires a collaborative approach from everyone, including parents, teachers, children and the broader community.

A great way to improve safety around the school is to decrease the number of cars on the road, particularly during the peak times. Encouraging children to walk or ride to school will help to reduce congestion and improve safety. It will also provide health benefits for the children.

If you need to drive your children to school, please obey the road rules and be polite and respectful to other drivers. There are also some useful [safety tips](#) available on Transport Canberra's website.

### Safe driving behaviours

Following the introduction of a new pedestrian crossing on Telopea Park, the school has become aware of a couple of incidents that are reducing safety for children.

While the school can become congested during the peak times, illegal car parking near crossings, speeding and inappropriate passing will not be tolerated. Some important things to remember:

- Parking on or near a pedestrian crossing is dangerous; it makes it difficult for passing motorists to see small children
- Drivers should not leave their cars unaccompanied unless they are in a dedicated car park
- Parking on the verges and gutters is dangerous and is subject to infringement; children shouldn't need to pass between cars to cross the road.

Try parking a little further from the school and walking to meet your child, or arrange a meeting point with your child so they can walk to meet you. It's not only a great way to avoid the congestion and illegal parking, it is also one of the most time efficient ways to ensure children receive the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity every day.



### Riding across pedestrian crossings

There is a current trial in place in the ACT allowing cyclists to ride slowly across signalised marked foot crossings, children's crossings and pedestrian crossings (at no more than 10km/h).

Riders must only ride on a marked foot crossing if the crossing is showing a green bicycle/pedestrian crossing light.

Cyclists are required to slow to 10km/h on the approach to the crossing, check for any approaching traffic and be prepared to stop. This is to allow motorists to see and respond to the cyclist before they make the crossing – motorists must give way to cyclists and pedestrians on crossings. Cyclists must also keep to the left of the crossing and give way to any pedestrians on the crossing.



The change to allow cyclists to ride across crossings is intended to provide amenity for cyclists, without compromising safety for cyclists and any other road user.

### Riding across pedestrian crossings

- When riding a bicycle you are able to ride slowly across signalised marked foot crossings, children's crossings and pedestrian crossings (at no more than 10km/h).
- You must slow to 10km/h on the approach to the crossing, check for any approaching traffic and be prepared to stop. This is to allow motorists to see and respond to you before you make the crossing – motorists must give way to bicycles and pedestrians on crossings.
- You must keep to the left of the crossing and give way to any pedestrians on the crossing.
- You may be issued a traffic infringement notice for failing to comply with the road rule, including failing to slow on the approach to the crossing and failing to check for approaching traffic. The penalty for each of these offences is \$118.

The P&C is seeking a new assistant returning officer, a public officer and a lost property officer. If you are interested, please come to the next P&C meeting on Oct 18<sup>th</sup> at 7pm or contact the P&C president Colombe Bories [president@telopeapnc.org.au](mailto:president@telopeapnc.org.au).

#### 1. Role of Lost Property Officer:

The lost property officer generally does whatever they can to help organise lost property and facilitate it's safe and speedy return home, including tidying up the lost property items on a weekly basis so that students and parents could more easily find their belongings, washing clothing and tupperware in need of a good scrub, and communicating regularly with the school community about lost property.

The lost property officer also works very loosely with the second-hand shop responsible; Unlabelled school uniform items are sold through the second-hand clothing pool if they are not collected after several weeks.

The position could easily be filled by multiple parents; anyone who has capacity to donate a small amount of time to hanging up clothes, washing stinky jumpers or corralling students and/or parents to collect lost belongings would make a great contribution.

#### 2. Role of Assistant Returning Officer:

Each school must have at least one Assistant Returning Officer (ARO) who is responsible for coordinating the election process.

School board elections - what are they and why do we need them?

A school board election is an approved process for the selection of representatives to the school board. School board elections are based on best practice election principles to ensure fair and democratic processes are followed.

#### 3. Role of Public Officer:

The Public Officer is responsible for form lodgement under the Act with Access Canberra, notifying the ACT P&C Association after AGM of change of office bearers and acts as the person who is `served` with notices to the P&C regarding legal service.

The Public Officer role requires around 10-15 hours annually. As for this school year, all required forms were lodged and there have been no notices to the P&C regarding legal service.
