## REPORT FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

Semester One is fast coming to a close with students and teachers working on assessments and reports in the coming weeks. ### Binational School Review

The school is welcoming two significant guests in the week commencing Mon 19 June 2017. They are Monsieur Bertrand Richet, Inspector Général de l'Éducation nationale, representing the French Government and Ms Sue Norton, Director of School Improvement ACTED, representing the Australian Government. Together, they are leading the Binational school review, which is conducted every four years.

## Fête de la musique

Fête de la musique is an annual music celebration taking place on 21 June. Fête de la musique was started by the French Minister of Culture in 1982. The festival has become an international phenomenon since 1982, celebrated on the same day in more than 700 cities in 120 countries. Fête de la musique will be celebrated at Telopea Park School on Wed 21 June. Parents/carers are invited to attend student recitals in the primary quad and Francophone Hall from 8.15 am. Further details will be provided.
