Thank you to the parents/carers who attended the primary information sessions Monday and Tuesday Week 2 and the Secondary information session with Year 7 Contact Group teachers on Tuesday Week 2 and this Thursday with the Provisieur and the EFS head teachers for the three EFS Y7 classes.

The secondary Physical Education (PE) faculty has been undertaking testing of students' swimming ability in Weeks 2 and 3 for students in Secondary and Primary in preparation for the swimming carnivals. Thank you to Megan Taylor, Thibault Le Gouëff and the PE teachers.

The term bulletins contain important information for each year group with specific dates for Term 1.

The Australian secondary Assessment calendar was emailed home to parents/carers at the end of Week 1 and is available on the school website. Students received a hard copy of the Assessment calendar on Monday 8 February. Parents/carers are encouraged to talk to their child about the Assessment calendar and guide them with strategies for dealing with busy periods in the term.

Thank you to the Year 10 Student Representative Council (SRC) representatives who took part in the Valentine's day activities on Monday 15 February. Students raised \$400 to support children in need.

Monday 22 February Year 10 students will be presenting their Personal Project to teachers in the secondary library. Students in the English Stream will attend school only for the Personal Project presentation. English French Stream students will be presenting their Personal Projects during Lines 1 and 4 and attending their French Stream classes for the remainder of the day.

Most Year 7 students will be issued with their Chromebook laptops from Tuesday 16 February. For students to receive a Chromebook in the secondary all permission forms must be returned to the IT Officer, Mr Komnacki in the Secondary Library. Secondary students are responsible for their Chromebook, they need to look after the device and ensure it is charged each evening. The Chromebook has a battery life of eight hours so there is no need for a student to charge their device during the school day.

A special thank you to parents/carers for supporting the school's uniform policy. We are very proud of the way our students wear the uniform and represent our school in such a positive collaborative manner.

School photos took place in Week 1 and Week 2. A catch-up session for any students who were not present will take place on Friday 12 March.

An important reminder to Parents/Carers - Teachers take up supervision of students 30 minutes before the beginning of the school day i.e. 8.20am- 8.50am (Secondary) and 8.30am -9.00am (Primary).

Any Primary student who arrives before 8.30am needs to be sent to Before School Care. There is a fee attached to this service. The same applies for any Primary student left in the school grounds after 3.30pm.

Please note that if your child is unwell, do not send them to school. If a child becomes unwell during the school day parents/carers will be called to collect their child and take them home. We are all responsible for each other's ongoing good health and wellbeing, we thank you for your cooperation and support in keeping everyone safe.

Le calendrier des évaluations australiennes du Secondaire a été envoyé aux familles par voie électronique à la fin de la première semaine; il est également disponible sur le site internet de l'école. Les élèves ont reçu une copie papier de ce calendrier le lundi 8 février. Nous vous invitons à échanger sur ce calendrier avec vos enfants et à leur proposer des stratégies pour faire face aux périodes où le travail demandé est plus intense.

Merci aux élèves de Year 10, membres du conseil des représentants des élèves (SRC) qui ont participé aux activités de la Saint-Valentin le lundi 15 février. Les élèves ont récolté 400 dollars pour venir en aide aux enfants dans le besoin.

Lundi 22 février, les élèves de Year 10 présenteront leur projet personnel aux enseignants dans la bibliothèque du Secondaire. Les élèves du courant australien ne se rendront à l'école que pour la présentation de leur projet personnel. Les élèves du courant français présenteront leur projet personnel pendant les cours des lignes 1 et 4 puis assisteront normalement aux cours du courant français le reste de la journée.

La plupart des élèves de Year 7 recevront leur Chromebook à partir du mardi 16 février. Pour que les élèves du Secondaire reçoivent un Chromebook, ils doivent rendre les formulaires d'autorisation complétés et signés à M. Komnacki, le responsable informatique, dont le bureau se trouve dans la bibliothèque du Secondaire. Les élèves du Secondaire sont responsables de leur Chromebook, ils doivent prendre soin de leur appareil et s'assurer qu'il est chargé chaque soir. Le Chromebook a une autonomie de huit heures, il n'est donc pas nécessaire pour un élève de charger son appareil pendant la journée scolaire.

Nous remercions tout particulièrement les familles qui nous aident à faire respecter le port de l'uniforme de l'école. Nous sommes très fiers de la façon dont nos élèves le portent et représentent notre école d'une manière aussi positive et bienveillante.

Les photos de classe et individuelles ont eu lieu en Semaines 1 et 2. Une séance de rattrapage aura lieu le vendredi 12 mars pour les élèves qui n'étaient pas présents.

STUDENT SERVICES

Welcome to 2021 from Student Services. Our team provides a wide range of support for students and their families with Restorative Practices, underpinning all we do. Students are encouraged to reflect on the impact of behaviours and what could be done differently next time. Year Coordinators Mrs. Teagan Ashworth (Year 7), Mr. Cade Williams (Year 8), Ms. Sheree Avard (Year 9) and Mrs. Melanie Consola (Year 10) support their cohorts. We also welcomed the return of Ms. Stacey Griffiths (Executive Teacher Differentiation), Mr. Des Proctor (Executive Teacher Student Engagement), Ms Natalie Worony (School Psychologist) and Ms. Bridget Perman (Student Support Officer) to our team for 2021. Please feel free to contact myself, Mrs. Kylie Louis (614 23379), Mr. Des Proctor (614 23393) or the appropriate

Year Coordinator, to discuss concerns and enable us to facilitate relevant Student Service referrals on your behalf.

All new students were given a "Welcome to Telopea Park School" pack, including a school booklet, to support their transition to our school. Students are always encouraged to visit Student Services to use the microwaves and hot water urns during recess and lunchtimes, collect notes and seek support in any way. Breakfast Club is held in the Canteen on Wednesday and Friday mornings from 8.15am and all students are encouraged to come and say hello!

Study organisation and routines are key components to successful students. Every student was given a Telopea Park School Handbook and a Student Services Business Card with information and links on the first day of school and I strongly encourage all students to develop homework and time management skills that suits them individually. The Handbook includes information about Telopea Park School, International Baccalaureate Middle Year Program and Study Skills, with Term Planners available in Student Services. Please take the time to support your child by requesting to view, and sign, semester Unit Outlines for each subject and discuss which items on the Assessment Calendar are relevant. Our Year Coordinators are also available to assist your child in study, organisation and goal setting. Learning Support Assistants are available lunchtimes on Monday, Wednesday and Friday in A1 for homework and study support. Details of these, and many more groups, are provided during Contact Group in the Student Daily Notices.

It is imperative that the school has up to date information with which to communicate as required. Please inform Student Services of any change in contact details, such as phone numbers and addresses, as soon as possible. Please be aware that our School Administrative System only has capacity to send emails/SMSs to one family contact. Please, also, know that Student Services has information regarding an ACT Government scheme which provides financial assistance to support low-income earning families with education expenses through the Secondary Bursary Scheme as well as MyWay Bus Concession Student Transport Program applications.

Attendance is crucial for students to achieve to their potential and maintain connectivity to the school. School hours are **8.50am – 3.15pm, Monday – Friday**. Students arriving late to school are expected to sign in at Student Services, regardless of time, with a note explaining their absence as a legal requirement. A parent/carer must contact the school within five days to explain an absence from school. The most effective way of communicating with the school is via email: student.welfare@telopea.act.edu.au or phone: 614 23385 (with a subsequent letter or email). Parents/carers will receive an SMS to notify when their child is marked not in attendance at school by 10.00am each day. Please, also note that students are not to attend school before 8.15am each day. Students requiring to leave the school for any reason during the day must provide a permission note from a parent/carer, collect a Leave Pass at Student Services and wait at the Front Office at the requested leaving time. It would be greatly appreciated if students could gain their Leave Pass as early as possible in the day and are punctual when waiting for their parents/carers. Students are also reminded that if they become injured or unwell during the school day they need to request a note to attend First Aid, who will contact their parents/carers.

Telopea Park School has a school uniform which should be respected by all students. Black leather shoes are an Occupational Health and Safety requirement of many subjects and students not adhering to these regulations may be excluded from taking part in classes in Arts, Technology and Science. Please feel welcome to contact me to discuss difficulties surrounding access to uniform, as well as, any other necessities for school.

Please be aware that all devices not being used for classwork must be switched off, and out of sight, whilst in the school buildings. Students are permitted to use mobile phones during recess and lunchtimes only. Please, also be aware that security of personal items is the

responsibility of students. If students need to bring any valuable items to school, please secure the valuables and do not leave items in bags whilst unattended. PE provides a secure storage of items during class. Student Services can store valuables for the day when items must be brought to school. Students are strongly encouraged to keep their valuables in lockers, PE storage or on their person whilst at school. Please refer to Telopea Park School Handbook for more information.

Please feel welcome to communicate any information or concerns to Student Services so we can best assist your child in achieving to their potential. I wish all students a wonderful 2021.

NOUVELLES DU PRIMAIRE

Chères familles,

Nous vous remercions de vérifier que vos enfants viennent à l'école avec un uniforme qui respecte les couleurs de l'école. Au nom de toutes les familles, nous remercions l'association de parents d'élèves P&C qui s'occupe du magasin d'uniformes et qui gère les objets perdus. Nous avons été ravis de voir que de nombreux parents ont assisté à nos réunions d'information et nous vous remercions pour le temps que vous avez passé avec nous lundi et mardi de la semaine dernière.

Nous rappelons aux familles que la surveillance des élèves dans la cour est assurée à partir de 8h30 le matin, et se termine à 15h30 l'après-midi. Il nous est très difficile de maintenir un environnement sûr si les enfants arrivent trop tôt à l'école ou s'ils attendent dans la cour que vous veniez les récupérer en fin de journée. Certains élèves arrivent dès 8 heures du matin et nous ne sommes pas en mesure d'assurer correctement la surveillance car les enseignants préparent souvent leur travail ou assistent à des réunions pendant ces heures.

Nous tenons à vous informer que, récemment, nous avons vu plusieurs élèves avec des montres connectées et d'autres dispositifs du même style. Les montres connectées, les téléphones portables, les montres de type Fitbit et autres appareils similaires permettant de se connecter à un réseau cellulaire, de prendre des photos ou des vidéos, ne sont pas autorisés pendant les heures normales de l'école. Ces appareils présentent un risque pour le bien-être et la sécurité des élèves. Lorsque ces technologies sont mal utilisées par les élèves, elles peuvent perturber le bien-être et la socialisation des élèves et, dans certains cas, leur causer du tort à certains égards. Nous vous remercions de nous aider à assurer la sécurité de tous nos élèves. Nous allons revoir notre règlement sur les technologies numériques et invitons les familles à nous contacter pour nous faire part de leurs réflexions sur ce sujet.

Les évaluations BASE pour nos élèves de Grande Section de Maternelle commenceront la semaine prochaine et se dérouleront sur deux semaines. Ces évaluations fournissent des informations qui nous permettent d'adapter le soutien que nous apportons à chaque enfant.

Elles nous permettent d'identifier rapidement ce que les enfants savent et peuvent faire au début de l'année scolaire, et aident les enseignants à déterminer le soutien dont les enfants ont besoin pour les aider à progresser. Les informations détaillées que nous recueillons sont de nouveau utilisées en fin d'année scolaire et nous permettent d'identifier les progrès réalisés par les enfants. Les évaluations sont présentées de manière amusante et attrayante pour les jeunes enfants, sous forme d'histoires. Les enseignants peuvent ainsi se faire une idée objective de ce que les enfants savent et peuvent faire dans les premières années de leur vie en matière de lecture, de calcul, de communication et de langage. Cette évaluation sera réalisée par plusieurs enseignants de l'équipe de Grande Section de Maternelle. De plus amples informations ont été fournies la semaine dernière, dans la brochure réalisée par les organisateurs des évaluations BASE. Dans le même esprit et les mêmes buts, les évaluations nationales françaises ont été effectuées par les enseignants français auprès des classes de CP et de CE1.

Les tests permettant de constituer l'orchestre des élèves de CM2 ont eu lieu la semaine dernière. De nombreux élèves ont posé des questions pertinentes sur le processus de sélection et l'implication attendue. Nous félicitons les élèves de CM2 pour leur comportement le jour des tests. Les élèves de CM2 invités à rejoindre l'orchestre recevront un courrier dans les prochaines semaines.

De nombreux projets ont été mis en place par les enseignants français et australiens pendant la pause méridienne.

Vincent Severac propose aux élèves un atelier journalisme. Les élèves travaillent comme de vrais journalistes : réunions de l'équipe de rédaction, reportages, photos, interviews, recherches d'informations, mises en page et productions.

Vincent propose également un atelier théâtre. Les élèves travaillent d'abord sur les mouvements, la voix, l'intonation, les expressions du visage et les gestes. Dans quelque temps, ils rédigeront et joueront une pièce de théâtre.

Aurore Severac propose aux élèves un atelier jardinage ainsi qu'un programme de développement durable. Chaque dernier vendredi du mois, nous enfilons un t-shirt, un polo ou un pull vert et nous relevons un défi collectif pour la protection de la planète.

Thibault Le Gouëff a formé une équipe de nageurs pour participer au championnat virtuel de natation dans le cadre des compétitions sportives internationales organisées par l'AEFE. Ce championnat réunit des élèves de toutes les écoles de l'AEFE de la région Asie-Pacifique. Les entraînements ont lieu à la piscine de Manuka.

La chorale est dirigée, cette année, par Christopher McLeod et Gwladys Renaudon. La première représentation est prévue le vendredi 19 mars à l'Alliance française dans le cadre des célébrations de la semaine de la francophonie.

Les réunions des élèves délégués du SRC commenceront dès que les élections auront eu lieu. C'est l'occasion pour les élèves de faire entendre leur voix dans l'école. Nous avons apporté quelques changements structurels à la lumière des demandes des élèves l'an dernier. Nous avons, par exemple, augmenté le nombre d'options offertes dans le cadre des cours d'art proposés aux élèves de CM2 et 6e. Les élèves qui forment notre SRC apprennent également à développer leurs compétences de leadership et à collecter des fonds pour diverses causes.

Susan Lewis continuera à offrir à nos élèves des activités d'arts visuels. Tim Ward-Harvey propose à nouveau à certains élèves, des séances d'approfondissement en sciences le jeudi.

PRIMARY NEWS

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for ensuring your children have commenced school wearing the correct school uniform. On your behalf, we thank the P & C for organising the uniform shop and lost property. We were delighted to see such a great turn out to our Information sessions last week and thank you for your time with us on Monday and Tuesday of last week.

A Reminder to Parents and Carers that supervision of students commences at 8.30a.m and ends at 3.30 p.m. It is very difficult to maintain a safe environment if children arrive at school early or are left waiting at the end of the day. Some students have been arriving as early as 8.00 a.m. and we are unable to adequately execute our shared duty of care as teachers are often preparing their own work or attending meetings during these times.

We wish to alert you to what we have seen of late and that is several students coming to school wearing Smart watches and similar devices. Smart watches, mobile phones, fitbits and similar devices with cellular, photographic and film capabilities are not permitted during school hours. The mobile nature of these devices poses a risk to student wellbeing and safety. When these technologies are misused by students, they can be very disruptive to students' welfare, socialisation and in some cases cause various levels of harm. We thank you for supporting us in keeping all our children safe. We will be reviewing our digital technologies guidelines and we invite interested parents and carers to contact us if you are interested in sharing your thoughts about this complex area.

BASE assessments will start in Kindergarten next week for the next two weeks. These assessments provide insight that can be acted upon to support the development of every child. It allows us to quickly identify what children know and can do at the start of the school year, and helps staff identify what support Children need to help them progress. Used again at the end of the same year, detailed reports will assist in identifying the progress children have made. The assessments are presented in a fun and engaging story-based manner for young children. Teachers can gain an objective picture of what children know and can do in early years literacy, numeracy, communication and language. This assessment will be carried out by several teachers in the Kindergarten team. More information was provided last week, in a booklet from the BASE organisers. Year 5 Band assessments took place last week. We had many students asking thoughtful questions about the process and procedures involved. Year 5s are to be congratulated on their behaviour on the day and approach to the assessment. Invitations to join the Year 5 band will be sent home in the coming weeks.

In addition, many projects have been set up by the French and Australian teachers during lunch time.

Vincent Severac is offering students a Journalism workshop. They will work like real journalists: editorial meetings, reports, photos, interviews, information research, layout and production.

Vincent is also offering a Theatre workshop. The students first work on movements, voice, intonation, facial expressions and gestures. After they have settled in, they will work on developing a theatre piece.



Aurore Severac is offering the students a Gardening workshop as well as a Sustainable Development program. Every Friday of the month, we put on a green t-shirt, polo shirt or sweater and we take up a collective challenge for the planet.

Thibault Le Gouëff has formed a swimming team to participate in a "virtual" swimming championship within the framework of International Sports Competitions organised by the AEFÉ. This championship brings together students from all AEFÉ schools in the Asia-Pacific region. The training sessions take place at Manuka swimming pool.

The choir will be up and running again and is directed, this year, by Christopher McLeod and Gwladys Renaudon. The first performance is scheduled for Friday 19 March at the Alliance Française as part of the Francophonie week celebration.

SRC will commence once students vote in their classes. This is an opportunity for students to have a voice across the school. We have made some structural changes based on what the students expressed last year through SRC and student surveys. An example of this is increased choice offerings in our Year 5 & 6 Arts rotations. Students who form our SRC also learn to develop their leadership skills and raise money for a variety of causes.

Susan Lewis will continue to offer our students an opportunity to take part in Visual Arts activities. Tim Ward- Harvey is offering the extension Science sessions again on Thursdays, to students who have been recommended by their teachers.

There will be more extra curricula activities offered to our students during the year and we encourage students to participate. Should you have any queries do not hesitate to get in touch with us.
