REPORT FROM DEPUTY PRINCIPAL (Secondary)

The end of semester 1, 2022 is fast approaching and it has been such a busy and rewarding semester for us all. As we are nearing the end of assessments, we ask that you remind your children that these tasks are designed to measure where they have reached in their learning. They go hand in hand with the ongoing formative assessments that students have completed in class already. Assessments are not a measure of a student's worth but are instead a measure of their progress in a set area. We ask that students use this time to show us what they have learnt and to try their best across all their classes.

Assessment is an important part of our educational journey, and it can be very stressful for many students. I encourage all students to access supports when they need it. In the high school they can visit Student Services (A3) and can access online supports and request help using the A3 website through their Chromebook (it comes up as a page when they log on). In primary, students and parents are encouraged to speak with their teacher or reach out to their Year Coordinator if they need additional support.

In Term 3, we will begin the major task of updating student support levels and areas of need. Early in the term families will receive an email about levels of student support at TPS. This will help us triage and organise the meetings with students and/or parents. If you do not receive this email by Week 3, please reach out to Melanie Consola. We have a diverse range of supports for our students with disability, mental health challenges or other additional needs. Firstly, we have a passionate and experienced teaching team that differentiate for individual students based on their needs, secondly our Year Coordinators send out a fortnightly bulletin to all staff which outlines the additional needs and information about students. Thirdly, for students that require additional supports we offer Adjustment Agreements. These are formalised plans which outline the supports or adjustments that the student needs. They complete this form with their Year Coordinator, CG teacher or Student Services staff. They then bring it home for their parents/ carers to sign and take it to their individual teachers to also sign and note the specific supports needed within their classroom. At the next stage we offer Individual Learning Plans (ILPs). These are for students with disability, mental health challenges or additional needs which require specific goals to be

reached during each term. These are often goals set by external support agencies or include research based and targeted interventions, that connect to their specific needs. Lastly, for students that need work to be presented to them from a different Australian Curriculum level to their peers we offer modified (P) programs. To sign up for these programs parents must give permission and then teachers select which AC level is most appropriate for their students.

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LE MOT DE LA PRINCIPALE ADJOINTE (Secondaire)

La fin du premier semestre 2022 approche à grands pas, un semestre très actif et enrichissant pour nous tous. Comme la période des évaluations se termine, nous vous demandons de rappeler à vos enfants que celles-ci sont conçues pour mesurer le niveau de leur apprentissage. Elles vont de pair avec les évaluations formatives continues que les élèves ont déjà effectuées en classe. Les évaluations ne mesurent pas la valeur d'un élève mais plutôt ses progrès dans un domaine donné. Les élèves doivent utiliser cette occasion pour nous montrer ce qu'ils ont appris et faire de leur mieux dans toutes leurs matières.

L'évaluation est une partie importante du parcours éducatif, et elle peut être très stressante pour de nombreux élèves. J'encourage tous les élèves à accéder aux aides mises à leur disposition lorsqu'ils en ont besoin. Au collège, ils peuvent se rendre à la Vie Scolaire (A3) et demander à accéder, depuis leur Chromebook, aux aides en ligne disponibles sur le site internet de la Vie Scolaire (une page s'affiche lorsqu'ils se connectent). Au primaire, nous encourageons les élèves et les parents à échanger avec les enseignants ou à contacter le coordinateur de niveau s'ils ont besoin d'une aide supplémentaire.

Au troisième trimestre, nous commencerons à mettre à jour les niveaux d'aide aux élèves et leurs besoins. Au début du trimestre, les familles recevront un courriel sur les différents dispositifs de soutien disponibles aux élèves du lycée franco-australien / Telopea Park School. Cela nous aidera à sélectionner les élèves et à organiser les réunions avec les élèves et/ou les parents. Si vous ne recevez pas ce courriel avant la semaine 3, n'hésitez pas à contacter Melanie Consola. Nous disposons d'une gamme variée d'aides et de soutien pour nos élèves en situation de handicap, souffrant de problèmes de santé mentale ou ayant des besoins particuliers.

Premièrement, nous disposons d'une équipe d'enseignants passionnés et expérimentés qui pratiquent la différenciation avec leurs élèves en fonction de leurs besoins. Deuxièmement, nos coordinateurs de niveau envoient une note bimensuelle à l'ensemble du personnel qui leur précise les besoins particuliers et les informations concernant les élèves. Troisièmement, pour les élèves qui ont besoin d'un soutien supplémentaire, nous proposons des aménagements (Adjustment Agreements). Il s'agit de plans individualisés qui décrivent les aides ou les aménagements dont l'élève a besoin. Les élèves remplissent ce document avec leur coordinateur de niveau, leur professeur de Group Contact ou le personnel de la vie scolaire. Ils le ramènent ensuite à la maison pour que les familles le signent, puis l'apportent à chaque professeur qui le signe et qui note les soutiens spécifiques à mettre en place dans sa classe.

Au stade suivant, nous proposons des plans d'apprentissage individuels (PAI). Ces plans sont destinés aux élèves en situation de handicap, souffrant de problèmes de santé mentale ou ayant des besoins particuliers qui doivent atteindre des objectifs spécifiques au cours de chaque trimestre. Il s'agit souvent d'objectifs fixés par des organismes externes ou qui

nécessitent des interventions ciblées et fondées sur la recherche et répondent à leurs besoins spécifiques. Enfin, pour les élèves qui ont besoin de travailler sur des documents qui diffèrent du niveau de programme australien sur lequel leurs camarades travaillent, nous proposons des programmes modifiés (P). Pour bénéficier de ces programmes, les parents doivent donner leur accord, puis les enseignants choisissent le niveau du programme australien qui correspond le mieux à leur élève.

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SECONDARY ENGLISH NEWS

Semester 1 has had its ups and downs with students and teachers alike going through health challenges and catching-up with curriculum requirements. I applaud a dedicated team of teachers in the English Faculty who are continuing to deliver quality lessons to all students, while making adjustments and negotiations in the completion of student assessments to enable success for all students.

Classes are settled and due to English running a year long programme, there will be very few changes, except in year 7. Based on student academic performance, some year 7 students are selected to go into challenge classes. The selection of students is strictly based on academic outcomes over the semester with their current cohort at Telopea. Challenge classes are reviewed each semester and movement in and out of the class occurs based on student results achieved at the school.

All students, regardless of their classes and streams are encouraged to continue to develop and refine their skills in English in Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking and Viewing with a particular focus on reading at home for at least 20 minutes each day to catch-up on reading of the assigned text. The robust development of macro skills prepares students for success in articulating their ideas in spoken and written texts, and in life-skills of communicating, negotiating, and presenting their ideas successfully to a wider audience.

Materials:

Students are advised to keep an Exercise book for English as a medium of recording their cumulative skill development, notes, and record of activities during class. Novels and plays are issued from the school library, and I request parents to encourage their child to return any novels and or plays that may still be overdue. We encourage students to bring a fully charged device to class since an exercise book and a device could be used interchangeably.

Assessments

The last assessment for this semester has been submitted by almost all students, and we are now in the process of completing reports. Both formative and summative assessments are an integral part of the teaching learning process providing students with opportunities to monitor their own engagement, skill development, and learning. Student's end of semester grade is informed by their performance in formative and summative assessments.

Performances:

This year, Bell Shakespeare is booked for two in-school sessions. Years 8, 9, and 10 students are provided with opportunities to watch a Bell Shakespeare performance in school on the 23rd of June in week 9. The performances are age-appropriated, entertaining, and enriching, with different perspectives of familiar texts woven in the fabric of English Language and

Literature. The performances complement classroom studies of William Shakespeare's plays. The cost of each performance is \$8.50 with a group capacity of 180 students. The scheduled performances will take place in the school hall and are as follows:

- Years 8 and 9 12:00pm (limited spaces available)
- Year 10 2:00 pm (spaces still available)

To secure your child's participation in this enriching performance, please pay at the finance office.

Competition/s:

Traditionally, students at Telopea perform very well in competitions and students have secured excellence medals three years in a row now! These medals are very few and awarded to the absolute high performers.

University of New South Wales International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (UNSW ICAS) has changed in format and provider. Further information about the ICAS English and Writing competitions will be provided during the two weeks break by Mr Tom Spollard. The tests are now online and parents can pay directly to the provider. Please pay by the due date. All students who are in Challenge English classes and those aspiring to move to challenge classes are strongly advised to participate in the ICAS English and/or Writing tests.


Thank you for your amazing support with our ECA program this term. It has been great to see how popular the program has been, and we are excited to soon release our program for Term 3 in the coming weeks.

We aim to provide a welcoming, warm and supportive environment for the children. This allows our children to feel safe and secure and to build strong friendships with other children in our service.

We have a mix of French and English-speaking educators who provide a range of games and activities and support children to make new friends across year levels.

In addition to varied weekly after school care programming, we offer a range of extra-curricular activities through the ECA program. The program is charged separately and involves a term commitment as professional instructors come into the school to run different activities. This term it is Soccer, Tennis, Taekwondo, and Capoeira. We also provide French Homework and conversation classes through this program.

A healthy afternoon tea is handmade each day in-house and provided for after school care and ECA children. Depending on the day, snacks this term include salad sandwiches, fruit, and homemade muesli bars. Breakfast is provided at before school care for students arriving prior to 8am.
