REPORT FROM DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

At the time of writing this, preparations for the La Grande Fête Saturday 02 November, are well underway. Rosters are being drawn up and volunteers called for. Many school groups have been busy rehearsing. Please support the Fête either through volunteering your time or spending your money. Please check the P & C webpage to see how you might be of assistance.

There is also a very significant Cyber Safety talk being presented for Parents on Wed 6th November in the secondary library. All parents and adults are invited to attend the "Think You Know" Presentation from 3.30 – 4.45 pm This is part of our Australian Curriculum Community forums series. This is definitely appropriate for adults with children from all year groups K-10.

Last week, several important events were held at the school. Year 10 students- Australian stream- who have enrolled at Narrabundah College for 2019 selected their Year 11 subjects on Wednesday 23 October. Thank you to both parents and teachers for supporting/advising the students in relation to these important decisions. If your child missed this there are catch up sessions available by contacting the college directly.

On Thursday of week 2, we celebrated the achievements of our primary school students by hosting their Learning Journey and the year 4 – 6 concert. Parents, grandparents and significant others had an opportunity to visit their child's classroom and listen to them present their work and reflect on what has been learnt and what their next step might be. On a similar note, our Kindergarten students have been participating in PIPS testing to ascertain their progress with literacy and numeracy this year. Parents can expect to receive the report before the end of term. Please ensure you also save the date for the **Year K-3 Concert in Term 4, Thursday 21 November, 11.15am -12.30pm.**

The P&C kindly supported recognition of teachers on world teachers' day on Friday 25 October by providing morning tea refreshments. This was greatly appreciated by staff.

Following on from the successful exchange in Canberra last term of 38 students from Noumea, our year 6 students, staff and the Proviseur are heading off on Wed 6 November for their reciprocal visit.

Congratulations to Rob Clements and the Year 7 Band on a recent successful tour to Sydney. Their audiences were most appreciative of the work that had gone into preparing for such performances. Make sure you catch them at La Grande Fête on Saturday. Thank you also must go to Mrs Susan Cribb for preparing the junior choir for some upcoming performances. They will also perform at our Fête but also Remembrance Day ceremonies here at school and at the French Embassy.

Thank you to our building services officers Nick and Ray for all the work they undertook over the break and to the Front Office staff, Linda, Deanne, Mariam, Brenda. Much of this work has helped prepare enrolment information for incoming students and to also prepare the grounds for the earth works of the new Quad and the restoration of the roof on the three story building. The upgrading of the secondary courtyard is definitely fully underway. It is important all community members are aware of this and the short term readjustments needed to facilitate this work. It is an exciting development that has been made possible through significant P@C, school and ACT government support. It has been 96 years since this area received its last significant facelift.

Telopea Park School Snow Sports

HIGH SCHOOL ANNOUNCEMENTS

If sick or injured, a student can come to sickbay before and after school, during breaks and during lessons (though they require a note from a teacher during a lesson). When a student arrives we will find

out what is wrong with them and take appropriate first aid actions and determine whether they need to go home or not. If they do need to go home, we will ring you or a contact person approved by you.

If your child contacts you to tell you that they are sick or have been injured during the day and have not come to sickbay, please ask them to come to sickbay so we that can assess them. Sickbay is also a safe place for students to wait (with a toilet and sink area) and is monitored by one of us continuously and it also means staff know where they are when you arrive.

Sick or injured students must be picked up by an appropriate adult (over 18 years old) and cannot walk home or catch the bus home by themselves. This is because we have a duty of care to sick and injured students.

Remember to advise the school if any of your contact details have changed. It is a good idea to include both your work and mobile numbers (as many contact phone numbers as possible in case of an emergency). Also provide an email address as we will sometimes email you if we cannot reach you by phone and please check that any contact numbers for relatives or friends that you have provided are up to date as well.

Please advise the school if your child has any serious health issues that may require a Health Action Plan. We can provide you with blank action plans to fill in (asthma, anaphylaxis, etc.).

You can also advise us of any other issues that may affect your child's health (i.e. gluten intolerance, allergies to food colourings, etc.) which you feel we should know about.

HIGH SCHOOL PE DEPARTMENT PE & Sport News

Wow, what a year it has been in PE & Sport. This semester has seen some movement in our faculty staff with Ms Darcy leaving at the end of term 3 to move to Canada, and Ms Hayley Goyne joining our team for the semester. Mrs Rayner and Mr Sherwin had some extended leave in term 3 and are back to finish off the year with a bang.

The following is a wrap up of all things PE and sport from term 3 and the start of term 4, and a few gentle reminders as the weather warms.

Physical and Health Education

All students have settled well into their PE classes for the semester. This semester, students commenced with a Skipping unit in preparation for a choreographed group routine. All students were actively engaged, and with the help of some special guest skipping instructors we were amazed by their skills and performances. Following skipping, students have completed units in various sports and health lessons. All classes have now completed their health unit. Health units for semester two were Healthy benefits of Physical Activity – Eat well, Live well (year 7), Mental Health (year 8) and Food, nutrition and healthy communities (years 9 & 10).

This week we have commenced our final rotation of sports for the semester, with the year finishing off with cooperative games and team challenges as well as swimming and water safety activities once Manuka Pool opens in late November.

Finally, just a gentle reminder to all students that they are required to get changed for practical lessons. This includes the PE shirt, navy shorts/trackpants and appropriate footwear. If you do not have a PE shirt then they can be purchased from the uniform supplier in Jamison. There are still a number of the older style PE shirts (limited smaller sizes) available from the PE staffroom – come and check with us first. While the majority of students are doing the right thing, there has been an increasing number of students coming to PE with unsuitable footwear. Flat soled shoes, such as Vans, Converse and other street style

shoes, do not provide the required support and traction needed for the activities covered in PE. Students are also requested to bring a hat through the spring and summer months as well as a drink bottle. Sunscreen is available for students to use when outside, but students are also welcome to bring their own, especially if sensitive to general sunscreen. This is also a timely reminder that changerooms are to be used for just that, changing for PE classes. Students are reminded that ball games are not to be played in the changerooms. In addition, please remember that deodorant aerosols are banned from the school due some students having serious allergies and asthmatic reactions to them. Roll-on deodorants are acceptable and encouraged, along with changing into appropriate clothing for classes.

School Sporting Teams

This year, students at Telopea Park School have had the opportunity to compete in a variety of sports against other students from ACT and surrounding NSW schools. The sports that students represented the school in during second semester were, in no particular order, soccer, netball, volleyball athletics and badminton. We were crowned Southside Champions in Athletics, represented at the ACT finals in Volleyball and Soccer, and won the ACT Championship in Badminton. Congratulations to all participants in each sport for your outstanding efforts and sportsmanship, and in your results.

Throughout the year we have many students who achieve at high levels in a wide range of sports. We would love to acknowledge these students and rely on them and their parents to let us know of their achievements. This year we have introduced the "Telopea Sporting Stars" wall, where parents and students have been encouraged to submit a poster of sorts to display, which outlines the sporting achievements (both on and off the field) of individual students. The document was emailed to parents earlier in the year and is available on ManageBac for all students. From next year we will be including a regular "community sport" section in Telopea Topics to highlight student achievements in our community.

House Sport

This year we have introduced more lunchtime sporting competitions and opportunities to play in the gym. A reminder to students that the gym is opened on Mondays and Thursdays for lunchtime games and fun. So far, we have had a year 7-8 and 9-10 Futsal competitions which proved very popular for both players and spectators. We introduced a "Big Ball Volleyball" year group house challenge which was thoroughly enjoyed by all participants, as well as some lunchtime activities during PE week at the end of last term. If you have any suggestions or recommendations, Students please see the PE staff on duty in the gym.

Elective Classes

This semester the fitness classes have regularly attended the local gyms – Fitness for life to Club Lime in Kingston and Fitness for Boys to Alive in Narrabundah. It is great to see the strength of our community partnerships and our students utilising the local businesses.

Outdoor Education students are busy preparing for their Coast camp in week 5 of this term, travelling to Queanbeyan Pool to work through their Australian Underwater Federation Pool Snorkel Award. Members of the semester 1 and 2 classes joined forces to travel the Penrith Whitewater Rafting Centre and enjoy a couple of hours of rafting. It was an action-packed time – lots of screaming and laughter, plenty of bodies falling out of the boats and even more holding on by the skin of their teeth. We are excited to be introducing a new Year 9 only Outdoor Education class in 2020, one that involves a range of activities including bush walking, climbing, overnight hikes and camping, as well as some studies into our local Indigenous culture.

Sports leadership students have been working at preparing their lessons for our Primary classes. Lots of fun games and activities, and even more laughs and giggles. It is great to see so many classes join us on Thursday afternoons out on the oval – it is a jam-packed oval with lots of activities. We are very thankful to the fabulous Primary staff for bringing their classes out. It is always a juggling act – the weather and various officiating roles at school, regional and ACT Primary sporting carnivals – but in the end, all students gain from the valuable interaction and leadership opportunities the class provides our students.
