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## PROTOCOLS FOR SUPPORT OF STUDENTS WHO DO NOT RETURN TO ON-CAMPUS LEARNING (ENSURING PEDAGOGICAL CONTINUITY)

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are looking forward to the return of students to the school. When teachers return to the classroom, they will no longer be able to teach remotely. Google Meets will no longer be standard practice as a medium for teaching our binational curriculum. It may be used for welfare checks.

### **Protocol for students not returning to on campus learning:**

If a student cannot attend school, our aim will be to support continuity in learning.

K-2 Teachers will provide work via Class Dojo and 3-10 Teachers will provide work via Google Classroom. We ask that families access these platforms regularly to check for learning tasks and information.

Teachers have been asked to post the work completed during the day by the students present on campus if appropriate.

- Work will be provided at the end of the day ( as it is difficult to know in advance the rhythm of work of the group of students)
- Parents and carers can expect the posted work to include:
  - A descriptive title of the task (e.g. addition with two digit numbers without regrouping)
  - A very brief description/explanation of the task if necessary where appropriate.
  - The exercise sheets and/or page and number of the exercise book or notebook
  - Homework requirements
- We ask that the work posted be returned to the teacher by the student in the same way e.g. Class Dojo, or on Google Classroom.
- The suite of resources including the weekly timetable and platforms such a Padlet that were provided during remote learning will no longer be provided.

Students not attending on campus learning will be contacted once per week. This will be by their class teacher in most instances but may also be by another staff member.

We look forward to working collaboratively with you, in a significantly different learning landscape, for the best outcomes for your child.
