IB MYP Evaluation Visit

The IB MYP Evaluation Visit takes place Monday 24 February to Wednesday 26 February. Thank you to the parents and students who have agreed to meet with the Evaluation Team. The Evaluation process has taken place over the last 12 months.

The school undertook a self-study questionnaire, reviewing the implementation of the IB Standards and Practices and the four IB policies (Academic Honesty, Language Policy, Inclusion Policy, Assessment and Reporting Policy). This is the third evaluation visit since 2010.

Presently on leave from UNHCR, she is undertaking doctoral studies at UNSW as an affiliate to the Andrew & Renata Kaldor Centre for International Refugee Law. Her thesis is titled: 'Re-thinking refugee protection in Southeast Asia: national laws, policies and practices in the 1950s and 1960s'. Her research interests are 'regional refugee protection', refugee status determination, statelessness, protection of civilians and the protection of refugee women and girls.

La visite d'évaluation du Programme du Programme Intermédiaire du Bac International aura lieu du lundi 24 au mercredi 26 février. Mme Yacoub est une avocate internationale travaillant pour le Haut-Commissariat des Nations Unies en charge des Réfugiés (HCR) ; elle a été affectée en Égypte, au Soudan, en Irlande, au siège des Nations Unies à New York, au Myanmar, en Australie et dans les États insulaires du Pacifique (dont Nauru et la Papouasie-Nouvelle-Guinée). Elle a commencé sa carrière en tant qu'avocate internationale à Canberra au bureau du Procureur Général, Bureau du droit international. Elle a également été amenée à prendre position au sein du Tribunal de contrôle des décisions concernant les réfugiés en Australie.

Actuellement en congé du HCR, elle entreprend des études doctorales à l'Université de Nouvelle Galle du Sud (UNSW) en tant qu'affiliée au Centre Andrew & Renata Kaldor pour le droit international des réfugiés. Sa thèse s'intitule : "Repenser la protection des réfugiés en Asie du Sud-Est : lois, politiques et pratiques nationales dans les années 1950 et 1960". Ses recherches portent sur la "protection régionale des réfugiés", la détermination du statut de réfugié, l'apatridie, la protection des civils, des femmes et des jeunes filles réfugiées.

HIGH SCHOOL ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Student Services Team provides a wide range of support for students and their families with Restorative Practices, underpinning all we do. Students are encouraged to reflect on the impact of behaviours, what could be done differently next time, and to take responsibility for their choices.

Year Coordinators Mr. Cade Williams (Year 7), Ms. Sheree Avard (Year 8), Mr. Phillip Lewington (Year 9) and Mrs. Diana Webster (Year 10) support their cohorts and we have also welcomed the return of Miss Natalie Worony (School Psychologist) and Mrs. Nicola Whitelaw (School Youth Health Nurse) to our team for 2020. Please feel free to contact Michele McLoughlin, Mrs. Kylie Louis (614 23379), Mrs. Melanie Consola (614 23361) or the appropriate Year Co-ordinator, to discuss concerns and enable us to facilitate relevant Student Service referrals on your behalf.

All new students were given a "Welcome to Telopea Park School" pack, including a school booklet, to support their transition to our school. Students are always encouraged to visit Student Services to get a fresh piece of fruit, use the microwaves and hot water urns during recess and lunchtimes, and seek support in any way. Breakfast Club is held outside Student Services on Wednesday mornings from 8.15am. All students are encouraged to come and say hello!

Study organisation and routines are key components to successful students. Every student was provided with a 2020 Telopea Park School Handbook on the first day of school and I strongly encourage all students to develop homework and time management skills that suit them individually.

The Handbook includes information about Telopea Park School, International Baccalaureate Middle Year Programme and Study Skills, with Term Planners available in Student Services. Please take the time to support your student by requesting to view, and sign, semester Unit Outlines for each subject and discuss which items on the Assessment Calendar are relevant.

Parents/carers are encouraged to join Managebac to access your child's assessment items, progress and resources. Our Year Coordinators are also available to assist your student in study, organisation and goal setting. A Study Group is available on Wednesday afternoons from Week 4 for assistance with homework and assignments in our flexible learning space, A1, with permission notes available in Student Services. Learning Support Assistants are also available lunchtimes on Monday, Wednesday and Friday in A1 for homework and study support. Details of these, and many more groups, are provided during Contact Group in the Student Daily Notices.

It is imperative that the school has up to date information with which to communicate as required. Please inform Student Services of any change in contact details, such as phone numbers and addresses, as soon as possible.

Your child will receive a "Detailed Information Sheet" during Contact Group this week for you to review, update and return to Student Services as soon as possible. Please ensure you return the sheet, regardless of any changes. Please be aware that our School Administrative System only has capacity to send emails/SMSs to one family contact. Please, also, know that Student Services has information regarding an ACT Government scheme which provides financial assistance to support low-income earning families with education expenses through the Secondary Bursary Scheme as well as MyWay Bus Concession Student Transport Program applications.

Attendance is crucial for students to achieve to their potential and maintain connectivity with the school. School hours are 8.50am – 3.15pm, Monday – Friday. Students arriving late to school are expected to sign in at Student Services, regardless of time, with a note explaining their absence as a legal requirement. A parent/carer must contact the school within five days to explain an absence from school. The most effective way of communicating with the school is via email: **student.welfare@telopea.act.edu.au** or phone: 614 23385 (with a subsequent letter or email). Parents/carers will receive an SMS which notify when a student is marked not in attendance at school by 10.00am each day. Please, also, note that students are not to attend school before 8.15am each day.

Students requiring leaving the school for any reason during the day are must provide a permission note from a parent/carer, collect a Leave Pass at Student Services and wait at the Front Office at the requested leaving time. It would be greatly appreciated if students could gain their Leave Pass as early as possible in the day and are punctual when waiting for their parents/carers. Students are also reminded that if they become injured or unwell during the school day they need to request a note to attend First Aid, who will contact their parents/carers.

Telopea Park School has a school uniform which should be respected by all students. Black leather shoes are an Occupational Health and Safety requirement of many subjects and students not adhering to these regulations may be excluded from taking part in classes in Arts, Technology and Science. Please feel welcome to contact me to discuss difficulties surrounding access to uniform, as well as, any other necessities for school.

Please be aware that all devices not being used for classwork must be switched off, and out of sight, whilst in the school buildings. Students are permitted to use mobile phones during recess and lunchtimes only. Please, also, be aware that security of personal items is the responsibility of students. If students need to bring any valuable items to school, please secure the valuables and do not leave items in bags whilst unattended.

PE provides a secure storage of items during class. Student Services can store valuables for the day when items must be brought to school. Students are strongly encouraged to keep their valuables in lockers, PE storage or on their person whilst at school. Please refer to Telopea Park School Handbook for more information.

PRIMARY NEWS

Dear parents/carers,

The first three weeks of school have been very busy!

Class and individual pictures are memories that your children "will cherish their whole lives", as Le Petit Nicolas's classroom teacher so aptly said in René Goscinny's novel.

The French and English curricula overviews of your student's year level have been sent home. The teaching staff, under the guidance of the Conseillère Pédagogique, is currently evaluating and reviewing the binational curriculum in order to refine and adapt it to the recent changes in the French and Australian curricula.

In weeks 3 and 4, our Kindergarten students will be taking the Australian Primary School Entrance Tests "BASE" developed by the University of Western Australia. This is a 15-20-minute individual assessment; students' answers are recorded directly by the teacher in the BASE database.

Year 1 and 2 students will soon be taking the French National tests in French and Mathematics. This diagnostic tool enables teachers to identify the special needs of each student and to differentiate teaching.

If you recently attended the parent information night, you were able to meet with your student's teachers, get practical information on how days and weeks are organised in our bilingual programme, and better understand the teaching and learning objectives and the expectations in terms of class work and homework.

Our Primary Swimming Carnival will take place on 11 March 2020. For safety reasons, Year 3- 6 students and identified Year 2 students will take a swimming proficiency test on Friday 21 February 2020 at Manuka pool.

As in past years, we celebrate French language in March. Francophonie Week will be held from 14 to 22 March, 2020. This year, the International Organisation of Francophonie (OIF) is celebrating its 50th anniversary!

Teloepa Park School / Lycée franco-australien de Canberra will study New Caledonia as a project topic. Mr. Binan, our Head of French Studies (Provisieur), is in contact with Mr. Yves Lafoy, the Official Representative of New Caledonia to Australia. Teloepa Park School/ Lycée franco-australien de Canberra has signed an agreement for the opening of a cultural space dedicated to New Caledonia in the Secondary library.



As in past years, the "Dis-moi dix mots" Competition is an opportunity for our students to engage in visual arts and writing activities.

Here are the ten words selected by the Ministry of Culture, focusing this year on water: aquarelle / watercolour (noun); à vau-l'eau / awry (adv.); engloutir / engulf (v.); fluide / fluid (adj.); mangrove / mangrove (noun); oasis / oasis (noun); ondée / shower (noun); plouf / splash (interj.); ruisseler / trickle (v.); spitant / sparkling (adj.).

NOUVELLES DU PRIMAIRE

Chers parents et responsables,

La rentrée scolaire a eu lieu il y a trois semaines seulement, mais celles-ci ont été déjà bien occupées !

Les photographies de classe et les photographies individuelles sont autant de souvenirs que vos enfants « vont chérir toute leur vie », comme le dit si justement la maitresse du Petit Nicolas de René Goscinny.

Vous avez reçu les programmes d'enseignement* en français et en anglais du premier semestre pour le(s) niveau(x) de classe de votre(vos) enfant(s).

L'équipe enseignante, sous l'impulsion de la Conseillère pédagogique, travaille actuellement à un état des lieux et à une révision du curriculum binational, afin de le clarifier et de l'adapter aux dernières évolutions des curricula français et australien.

En semaines 3 et 4, les élèves de Kindergarten/Grande Section passent individuellement les tests australiens d'entrée à l'école primaire « BASE » développés par l'Université d'Australie Occidentale. Il s'agit d'une évaluation de 15-20 minutes ; les réponses des élèves sont directement enregistrées par l'enseignant dans la base de données BASE.

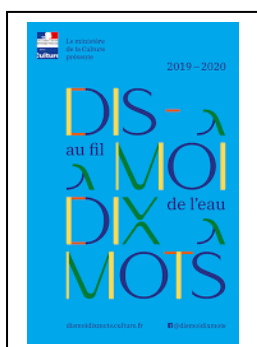
Les élèves de Year 1/CP et de Year 2/CE1 passent, quant à eux, les évaluations de rentrée du Ministère français de l'Education nationale en français et en mathématiques. Ces évaluations ont un objectif diagnostique, afin de permettre à l'enseignant de déterminer les besoins spécifiques de chaque élève et de différencier son enseignement.

Les réunions de rentrée vous ont permis de connaître les enseignants de vos enfants, de recevoir des informations pratiques sur l'organisation bilingue de la journée et de la semaine scolaire, mais aussi de mieux comprendre les objectifs du niveau de classe et les attentes en matière de travail en classe et de devoirs à la maison.

Dans la perspective de la Journée de la natation, le 11 mars 2020, pour des raisons de sécurité, les élèves de Year 3/CE2 à Year 6/6ème et les élèves de Year 2/CE1 sélectionnés passent un test de natation le vendredi 21 février 2020, à la piscine de Manuka.

Comme les années précédentes, le mois de mars est le mois de la célébration de la langue française. La Semaine de la Francophonie 2020 aura lieu du 14 au 22 mars 2020. Cette année, l'Organisation internationale de la Francophonie célèbre son 50ème anniversaire !

En ce qui concerne notre établissement, Telopea Park Primary School s'est vu attribuer la Nouvelle-Calédonie comme pays d'étude.
