

Dear parent and carers,

I am writing with additional information about the return of students to our school campus. First, a reminder about the return dates for students.

<b>Commencing 31 January</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Preschool and kindergarten</li> <li>• Years 7 and 11</li> <li>• New student orientations</li> <li>• Out of school hours care (OSHC)</li> </ul>
<b>Commencing 1 February</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Years 1 - 6</li> <li>• Years 8 – 10</li> <li>• Year 12</li> </ul>

Drawing on national and local health advice, we have developed a return to school plan which has three key priorities:

- the health and safety of staff and young people
- the mental and emotional well-being of students and staff, and
- ensuring continuity of learning.

Below is an outline of [ACT Health Guidelines](#) that schools are required to implement to ensure effective COVID-19 measures are in place.

<b>Student illness</b>	Anyone who is unwell, symptomatic or who are household close contacts must not be at school or preschool. This applies to staff and students. If they attend when unwell, they will be sent home.
<b>Masks</b>	Staff, visitors and students* in years 7-12 must wear a face mask on campus. Students in years 3-6 are encouraged to wear a mask if they are comfortable doing so. Students in Preschool to year 2 are not required to wear a mask. Masks may not be suitable for students with a disability or medical condition and schools will make allowances for those students not to wear masks. <i>* Masks will be available at school for those who require them. Disposable masks need to be changed every four hours.</i>
<b>Physical Distancing and cohorting of staff and students</b>	Physical distancing between children and young people is not always possible, particularly in single classrooms and school environments. It is however important for limiting the transmission of COVID-19. To support cohorting of staff and students, we may adjust learning programs, stagger starts, breaktimes, and timetables as well as pick up and drop off arrangements. More specific information about what this means for your child is included below.
<b>Hand hygiene and COVID smart behaviours</b>	Schools will maintain and promote hand and respiratory hygiene practices. Students will need to wash hands and use hand sanitisers throughout the day. Students will not be allowed to share food or drink.

<b>Environmental cleaning</b>	Our school cleaning program includes regular cleaning of high touch point services, frequently used objects, common areas, toilets and play equipment.
<b>Ventilation</b>	All schools are following an Indoor Air Quality Plan. Improved ventilation and increased outdoor learning will be implemented where appropriate. Ventilation systems have been adjusted to increase fresh air circulation and plans will be updated to reflect improvements made since 2021
<b>Vaccination</b>	The ACT has one of the highest vaccination rates of any city in the world and this is reflected in our teaching workforce. COVID-19 vaccinations are also mandated for staff working across early childhood education and care services, preschools, primary schools, Out of School Hours Care, specialist school settings and P-10 schools, or schools that share campus space with students in year 6 or below. These requirements are in place until the conclusion of the public health emergency.
<b>Visitors and use of Check in CBR app</b>	All students aged 16 and above, staff and visitors must check in using the 'Check in CBR' app. Parents and carers are allowed on school grounds for scheduled appointments only. Special arrangements will be made for children starting at a new school or early childhood service in 2022, or children with special needs who require transition visits prior to the commencement of the new school year.
<b>Wellbeing supports</b>	<p>Wellbeing and learning supports, such as face to face appointments with the school psychologist or access to a Learning Support Assistant, will recommence with the return to school. They can be accessed through the schools established referral process. If the school psychology position is temporarily vacant, you can book an appointment for your child with our Central Telehealth team by filling a <a href="#">booking request form</a> or emailing <a href="mailto:Telehealth@ed.act.edu.au">Telehealth@ed.act.edu.au</a>. Central Telehealth Service is available between 9:30 – 4:30 pm during weekdays.</p> <p>For parents and carers of students with a medical vulnerability: If you wish the school to make reasonable adjustments for the safe return of your child, you must consult a GP and provide medical advice to that effect. Where adjustments can't be made, the school will support your child to learn from home.</p>
<b>Managing COVID-19 in schools</b>	<p>We are prepared to respond to a positive COVID-19 case on campus. A student who presents with symptoms of COVID-19 will be isolated with suitable supervision, and parents will be required to collect their child. Symptomatic students will be required to wear a mask. Symptomatic staff and visitors will be advised to travel directly home.</p> <p>If a staff member, child, young person or visitor is diagnosed with COVID-19 and has attended a school site during their infectious period, they are required to advise their school.</p> <p>Where a COVID-19 case in a school leads to students and staff being assessed as at risk of exposure, those impacted will be informed by the school about what they are required to do in line with ACT Health requirements. If the exposure is considered low risk, students and staff will continue to be able to attend school while closely monitoring for COVID-19 symptoms.</p> <p>Risk assessments are based off the ACT Health Guidelines for Schools.</p>
<b>COVID-19 screening</b>	Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms should get a PCR or Rapid Antigen Test immediately.



	Parents entering the Kindergarten playground need to ensure they scan in using the Check in CBR app, wear a mask while onsite and physical distance from other families and teachers. <b>Please do not come to the school if you are unwell.</b>				
Hygiene routines	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Teachers will remind students regularly about hand hygiene and signs relating to hand hygiene have been placed around the school.</li><li>Hand sanitiser will be available in every classroom and each teacher will also have hand sanitiser and sanitising wipes.</li><li>Hand sanitiser will also be situated at mask disposal areas around the school.</li></ul>				
Teaching and learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>A number of suitable outdoor learning spaces have been identified in different areas of the school. A booking roster has been organised for the outdoor learning spaces identified for teachers to book, including Music, Art and Physical Education.</li><li>It is recognised that teachers are not able to provide remote online learning and face to face lessons concurrently. <b>Events and Excursions</b>	<p>Unfortunately, during Term 1 no camps or sporting carnivals will take place. If you have already paid for a camp that was scheduled for Term 1, please contact the school's finance office via the general phone number (61422238) or email <a href="mailto:tps@telopea.act.edu.au">tps@telopea.act.edu.au</a> to organise a refund.</p> <p>We will still be running beginning of the year information sessions for parents and carers, which will be online. Details about these events will come home to you shortly.</p>	

We will continue to review and adjust these measures based on the most up to date advice from ACT Health.

During this time we may experience impacts on our workforce due to the requirements of staff to isolate under ACT Health directions. We will work closely with the Education Directorate to make appropriate adjustments to ensure student and staff safety. This may include using casual relief staff, combining of classes, limiting or cancelling non-essential activities, switching to the provision of supervision only or possibly temporary transition to remote learning.

Remember, all adults and children aged 5 years and above are eligible for vaccination. If your child is eligible but not yet vaccinated, we encourage you to book them in by calling the COVID-19 vaccination line on 5124 7700 daily between 7am-7pm. Bookings can also be made with some [GP clinics and pharmacies](#).
